You may have noticed an additional envelope in your offering packet this month. The envelope is marked for gifts to the Margaret Lackey State Mission offering. I'd like to give you some information about the MLSMO offering.

The Margaret Lackey State Mission offering adds to and works hand-inhand with the evangelistic and benevolent ministries funded through the Cooperative Program in Mississippi. Here are some examples:

- Support for Camp Garaywa and Central Hills, our children's summer camps. Nearly 8000 kids attend Miss. Baptist summer camp sessions. Because of the State Mission offering, families of any income level can afford to send their child to camp. Last year almost 1000 children made decisions for Christ through camp ministry.
- Mississippi Baptist Disaster Relief.
- Criminal Justice ministries.
- Job skills ministries.
- Church planting support.
- International student ministry support through BSU.
- Plus, much more



Having worked for the Mississippi Baptist Convention prior to coming to FBC, I saw firsthand the usefulness of this offering. Mississippi is a Convention of mostly small Baptist churches. While over 2000 churches in Mississippi cooperate with the Miss. Baptist Convention, only 75 or so have an average weekly attendance of more than 250.

I find it alarming to know that only about 1/4 of the population of Mississippi attend any kind of worship service in a year. The ministries supported by the Margaret Lackey State Mission offering focus on reaching what most would call "the least of these." No one church can reach these important Mississippians.

We can reach our state with the gospel but only if we work together. Your support for State Missions is a way to work together in sharing the gospel. I hope you'll prayerfully consider giving to this important offering this month.
